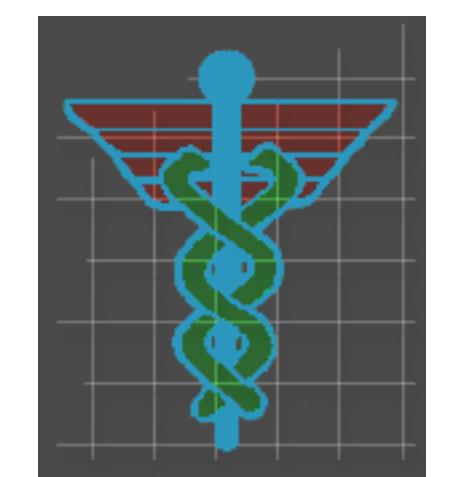

## Objectives

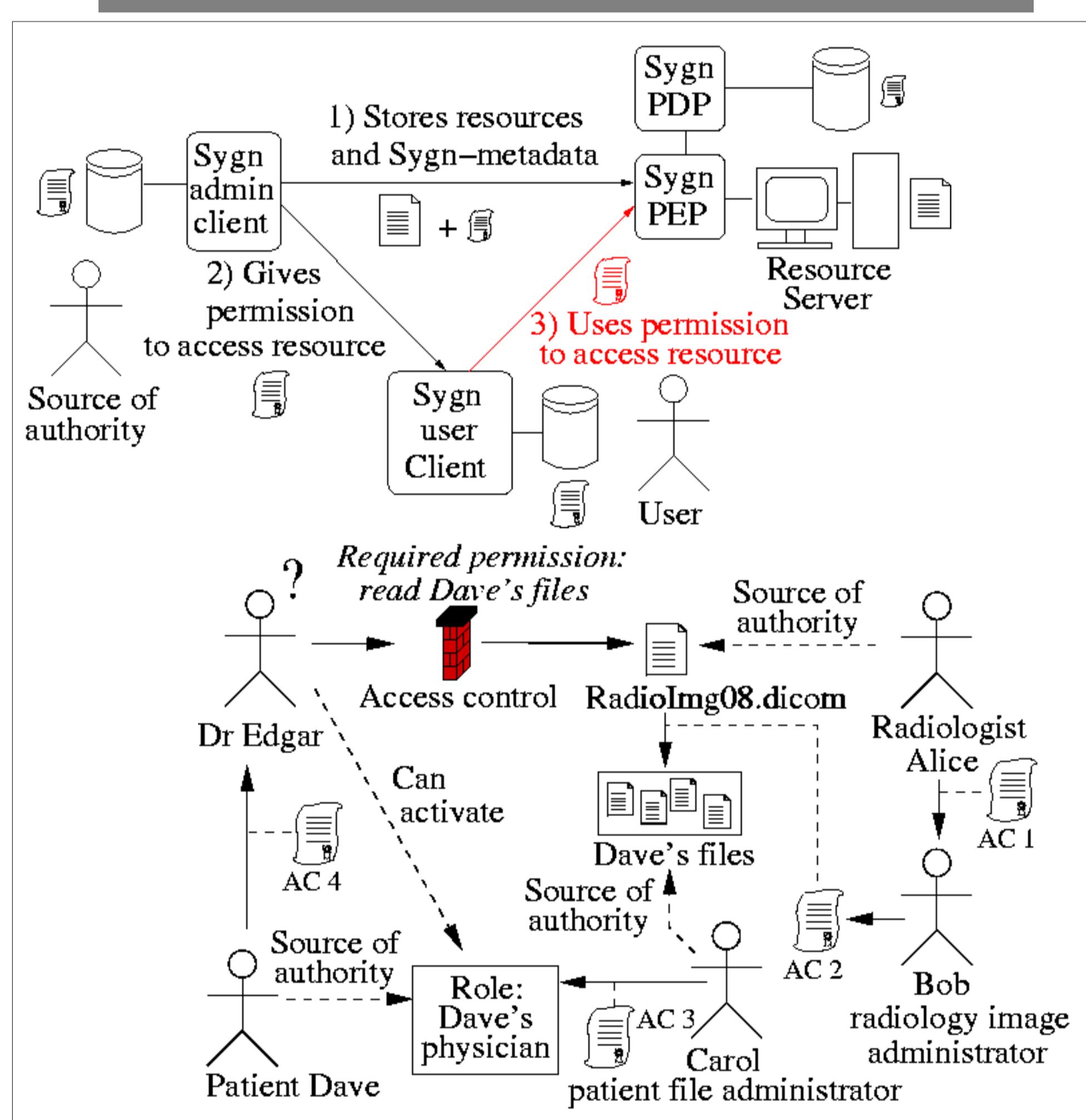
The aim of the MEDIGRID project is to explore the use of the GRID technologies for tackling the processing of huge medical image databases available in the hospitals today. The very large size of medical datasets, and the complexity of some modeling and signal processing algorithms create the need for tremendous processing power and storage capacity. The MEDIGRID project is addressing to kind of medical applications for which GRIDs can bring a valuable support:

- Complex image processing algorithms requiring a parallel implementation to become tractable.
- Tools for handling and processing complete databases of medical images.
